Winter Solstice Festival (冬 至)

Winter Solstice Festival (*Dong Zhi* 冬至) is one of the most important festivals celebrated by the Chinese and other East Asians including Koreans, Japanese and Vietnamese. This day also marks the shortest day and the longest

night of the year. *Dongzhi* usually falls between 21-23 Dec of the year. This year, it falls on 21 Dec. *Dongzhi* is a time for the family to get together to make and eat *tangyuan* (汤圆): colourful glutinous rice rolled into balls and cooked in sweet soup. It is also offered to ancestors in prayers. Eating of *tangyuan* symbolizes reunion and togetherness. Devotees who prayed to *Tai Sui* (太岁) must return offerings to *Tai Sui* before *Dong Zhi*.

Divination for Lunar 11th Month -Lot No. 39

A Divination Lot is a tool for communication between devotees and their deities. A devotee silently asks for guidance from the Deity, shakes a bamboo canister containing a set of wooden Divination Lots till a Lot drops out of it. Every Divination Lot is numbered and a devotee collects the actual printed Lot based on the number on the wooden Lot he/she has drawn.



Thian Hock Keng Divination Lots are also known as Mazu (妈祖) Divination Lots.

There are 60 Lots. They also show monthly readings (月令).
